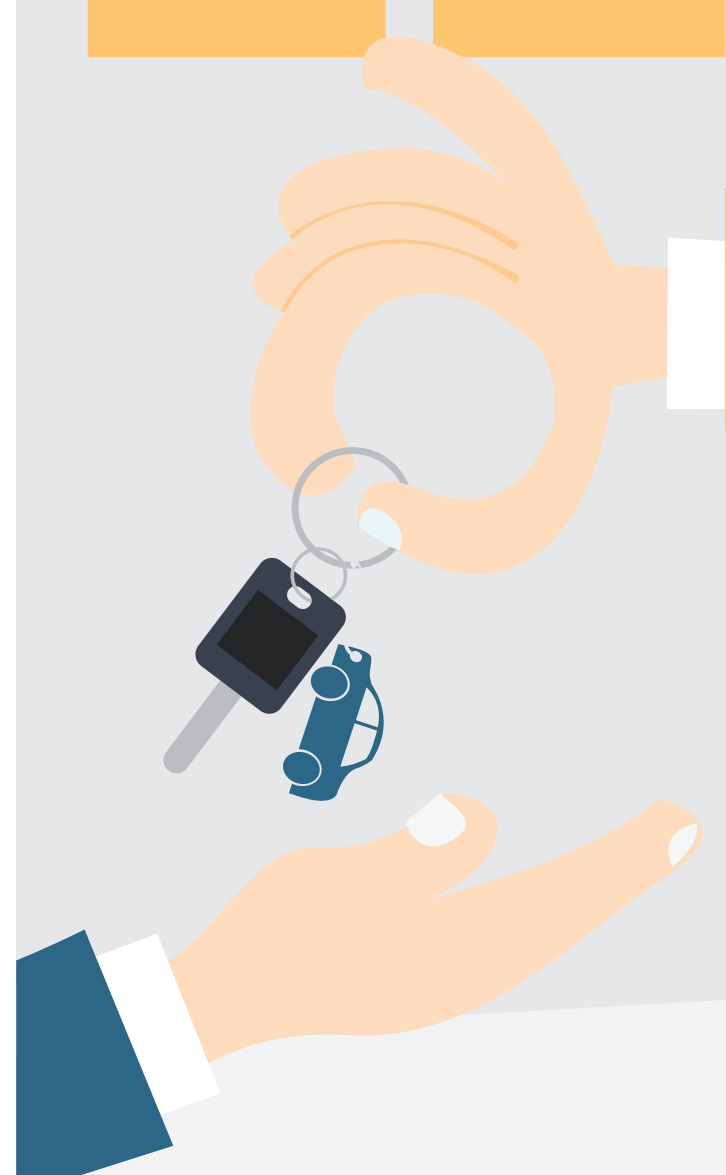


California's LEMON LAW



Through the **lemon law**, a consumer can have their vehicle replaced or get their money back.

A "lemon" is a vehicle with a substantial defect that cannot be easily repaired. Most states have their own laws that protect consumers after they purchase a defective vehicle. California's lemon law - the Song-Beverly Consumer Warranty Act - is one of the strongest in the nation.

Lemon laws apply to new, used and leased vehicles, if the vehicle is covered by a factory warranty.

Examples OF A LEMON

Any substantial defect, particularly one that is a safety risk, is a characteristic of a lemon. This includes:

DEFECTIVE BRAKES



DEFECTIVE STEERING WHEEL



DEFECTIVE ENGINES OR ENGINE COMPONENTS

GAS LEAKS



ANY OTHER DEFECT THAT COMPROMISES THE SAFETY OF OCCUPANTS

HERE IS WHAT YOU SHOULD DO...

01. Notify the manufacturer of the problem.
02. Send any letters or notifications to manufacturers through certified mail and keep receipts.
03. Keep records of everything related to your vehicle, including bills, repairs and correspondence with manufacturers.
04. Call a lemon law attorney for assistance.
